Ku Kahakalau, Stated that the TMK are inconsistent within the Puuanahulu paper work and should be checked.

Discussion:

Debralee Kailiwai Ray, read her testimony and stated that descendants still do not have clear access.

Jim Moore, notes that actual easements are pending County approval and were provided at last HIBC meeting.

Ku Kahakalau, stated that access needs to be via current road and not future road.

Jim Moore, stated that access is included on page 13 of the latest revised BTP.

Attorney General, Stated that there could be a problem with what is up for determination today. Agenda does not state "Preserve in Place". Has this been done already?

Ku Kahakalau, asked if all the other issues been resolved.

Debbielee Kailiwai Ray, stated "Yes".

Attorney General, stated and confirmed that Preserve in Place previously determined.

Ku Kahakalau, stated that owner and descendants work with SHPD staff to delineate access to all parcels.

Discussion:

Glenn Escott, cemetery with 16 graves and only 2 with dates.

Roy Helbush, What type of fence?

Glenn Escott, stated that a chain link fence or wire like the roping club uses. Rock wall too expensive for the church.

Leningrad Elarionoff, Comments are written on his BTP received and note page 4; county map shows belt road in wrong place. That Figure 7 on page 9 still shows road from 1970's TMK. That page 9 the name should reflect as "Maioho". Has any Lineal descendants been contacted.

Glenn Escott, stated that they did not identify any lineal descendants.

Leningrad Elarionoff, requested to add "Lineal Descendants" to the statement in who will maintain the cemetery.

Bucky Leslie, stated that he knows one name of a lineal descendant who lives in Honolulu.

Analu Josephides, commented that SHPD made recommendations for them to publish a notice in the OHA paper since its free for Burial notices.

Leningrad Elarionoff, requested that a greater effort should be made in contacting lineal Descendants.

Bucky Leslie, requested that a publication be made in the OHA paper.

Ku Kahakalau, stated that page 46 state burials be previously known and not inadvertent and on page 47 under maintenance that any problems you must contact SHPD and known lineal descendants.

Leningrad Elarionoff, requested that remove “daylight hours” restriction because Hawaiians have cultural activities at night and please publish into OHA paper and include Peke and Beck names.
